



JELLIN&E Style

Jellinge (900 to 980 A.D.)

The Jellinge style is named after a grave find in Jelling in Denmark.

This was a town in the Viking age and one of the main seats of power and trade in the Danish kingdom at the time.

The most beautiful artefact found was the Jelling silver cup.

This piece probably belonged to the king or queen of Denmark, or at least a powerful Jarl (earl) or a Jarl's wife.

The Jelling style includes a band of square formed patterns that run along the swirling and swaying body of the animal.

This animal is relatively realistic in look – much more realistic than the animal forms of the Broa style.

The animal stretches along the surface with more elongated and flowing shapes than in the Borre style.

The Jelling style was popular among artisans between around 900 and to almost 1000 A.D.
