It is to remember the coming of the Holy Spirit to the apostles and other followers of Jesus. 3,000 people were baptized that day. It is also the churches birthday.	
Holy spirit	The third part of the Trinity, God as spiritually active in the world.	
Resurrection	The Christian belief that Christ rose from the dead.	
Apostles	The twelve chief disciples of Jesus Christ.


