Focus on the 'five-ness of 5' using one hand and the die pattern for 5. Comparison of sets - by matching. Use the language of comparison: more than, fewer than, an equal number. Explore the concept of 'whole' and 'part'. Focus on the composition of 3, 4 and 5. Practise object counting skills. Match numerals to quantities within 10.
