### Step 6: Book Appointments (Automatic)

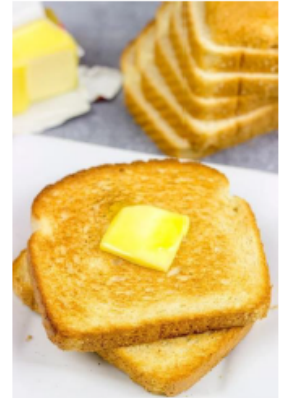

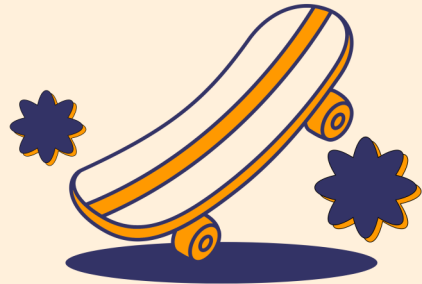
