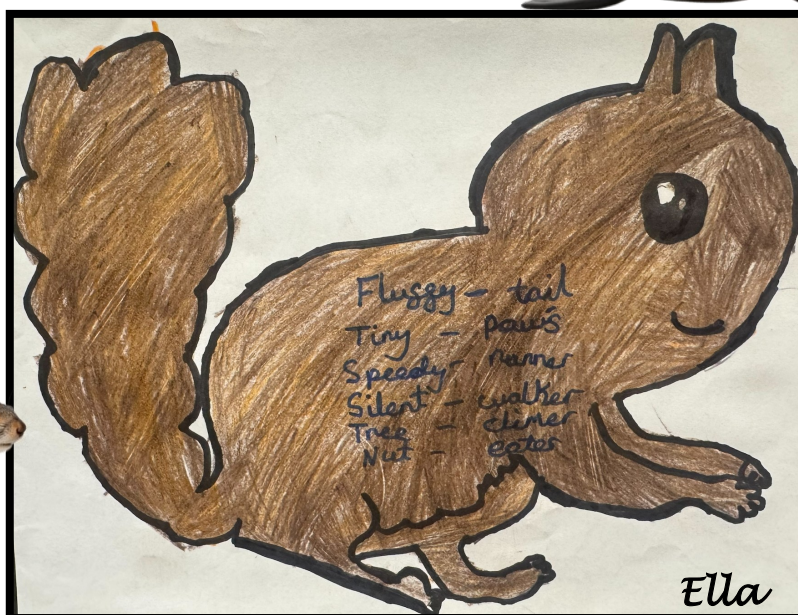
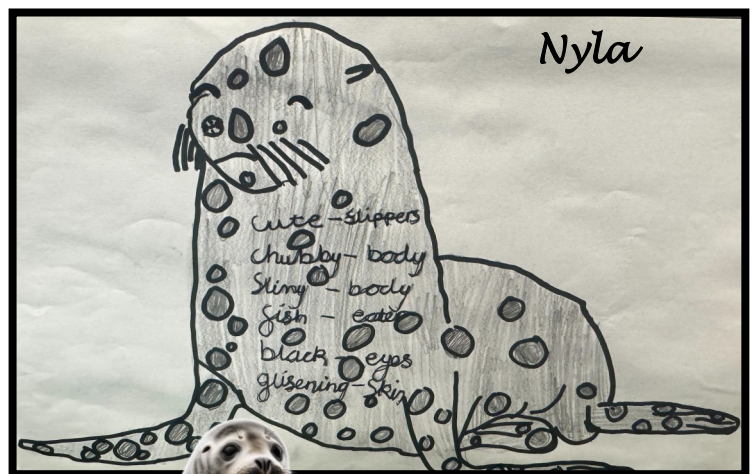
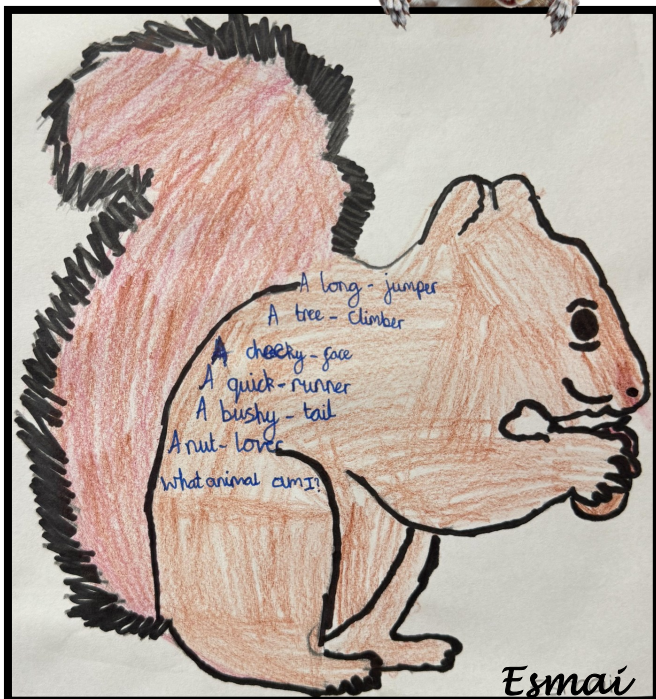
During the winter, plain black leggings or jogging bottoms may be worn for outdoor games.
