The Government's Great British Summer Savings scheme runs from 25th June to 1st September. VAT has been reduced on a range of family activities, including children's menu meals, children's tickets for cinemas, theatres and concerts, and entry to attractions such as soft play centres, museums, wildlife parks and amusement parks. In addition, children aged 5–15 can travel on buses across England free throughout August. More information can be found by searching online for 'Great British Summer Savings'.

During the winter, plain black leggings or jogging bottoms may be worn for outdoor games.

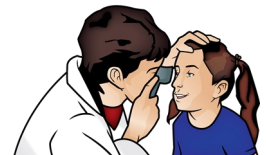
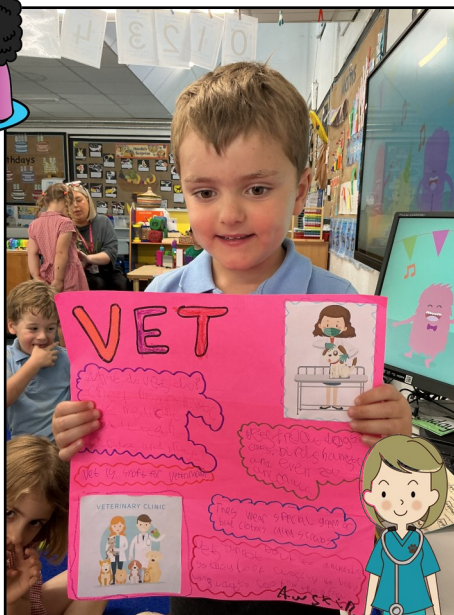
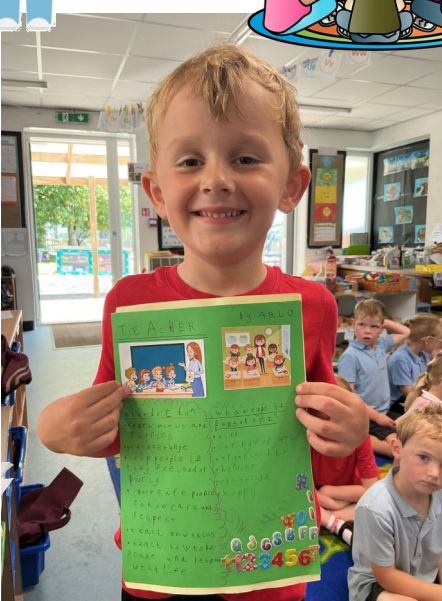
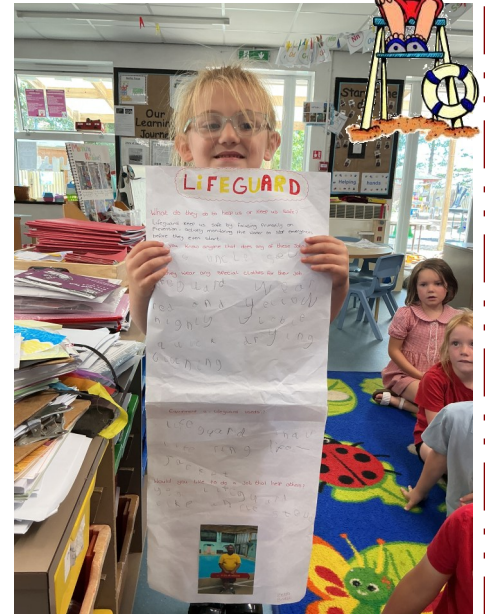
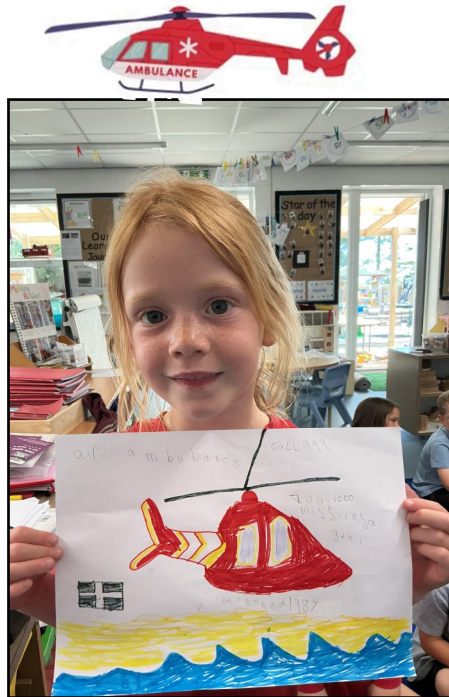
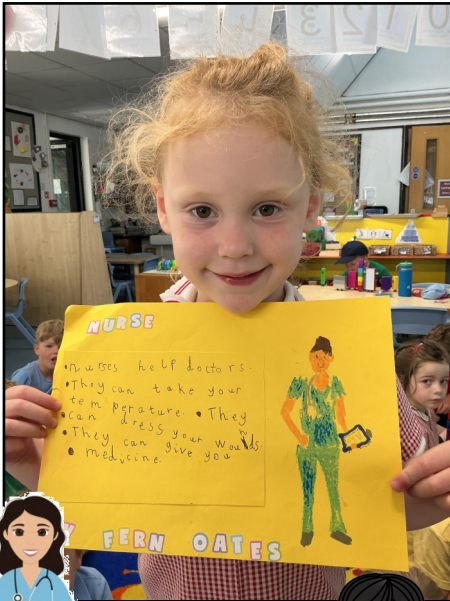
